
## Vietnam

I enlisted in 1967 when I was 18. I left for MCRD (Marine Corps Recruit Depot) in San Diego in August of 1967. I came home after Boot Camp then returned for artillery school in Fire Direction Control. Jungle training came next.

When I left for Vietnam I flew to Okinawa, then to Da Nang, then to Quang Tri. That was late January '68 or early February '68 during the Tet Offensive. I was assigned to Headquarters Battery 3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion 12<sup>th</sup> Marines 3<sup>rd</sup> Marine Division and served on several LZ's in the northern I Corps.

I ate a lot of C-Rations which I enjoyed and had hot food now and then.

I made several life-long friends while serving. One, from Texas, Jerry (Hot Rod) Crawford, I

My rotation was up so I went to Da Nang, flew to Okinawa, then to San Francisco, and on to Omaha. That was March of 1969. I was 19 years old. I was proud to serve and I would do it again.
